



# 2010 Early Childhood Community Profile

## Summary sheet for the Shire of Northern Grampians

### Local demographics for young children aged 0 to 8 years and their families.<sup>1</sup>

- There were 114 births notified to the local Maternal and Child Health services in Northern Grampians during 2008-09. This represents a decrease of 11.4 per cent since 2006-07 and a decrease of 26.0 per cent since 2000-01. This compares to an increase in birth notifications across Victoria of 2.3 per cent since 2006-07 and 18.6 per cent since 2000-01.
- At 30 June 2008, there was an estimated 12,322 people residing in Northern Grampians. Of these, 1,258 were aged between 0 to 8 years, representing 10.2 per cent of Northern Grampians's total population.
- The population aged 0 to 8 years in Northern Grampians is projected to decrease by 31.5 per cent by 2026, while the total population in Northern Grampians is expected to decrease by 11.0 per cent over this period.
- Using the Index of Relative Socioeconomic Disadvantage, Northern Grampians was ranked 6 out of 79 LGAs in Victoria. A rank of 1 was assigned to the most disadvantaged LGA in Victoria.
- Of the 751 families with children aged between 0 and 8 years in Northern Grampians, 81.8 per cent were couple families and 18.2 per cent were one parent families.
- There were 87 Aboriginal persons in Northern Grampians, representing 0.7 per cent of the total population. 21.8 per cent of the Aboriginal population in Northern Grampians were aged 0 to 8 years.

### Health, learning, wellbeing, development and safety indicators for children in the local area.<sup>2</sup>

- 49.3 per cent of infants in Northern Grampians were fully breastfed at 3 months and 39.9 per cent of infants were fully breastfed at 6 months.
- 95.9 per cent of children in Northern Grampians were fully immunised at 12-<15 months, 92.4 per cent were fully immunised at 24-<27 months and 85.8 per cent were fully immunised at 60-<63 months.
- 132 Prep children were surveyed in the Australian Early Development Index (AEDI) in Northern Grampians during 2009. Of these, 29.1 per cent were vulnerable on one or more domains and 14.2 per cent were vulnerable on two or more domains.
- In 2008, 80.0% students enrolled in government schools in Northern Grampians were achieving a reading accuracy score of 90% or more on Level 5 texts, 83.2% of Year 1 students were reading Level 15 texts with over 90% accuracy and 88.8% of Year 2 students were achieving 90% accuracy or higher on Level 20 texts.

### Families in Northern Grampians.

- Based on the 2009 VCHWS survey results, 48.2% of children aged 6 months to 12 years were reported to have been read to almost every day in the Grampians region. This was similar to the proportion of children being read to almost every day across Victoria (48.3%).
- Based on the 2009 VCHWS, 3.3% of main carer's of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region were classified as being of high risk of psychological distress. This proportion was lower, but not significantly different to that reported across Victoria (3.7%).
- In 2008 - 2009, 5 substantiated cases of child abuse were recorded in Northern Grampians, representing a rate of 4.0 per 1,000 children aged 0 to 8 years in the area. This compares to a rate of 7.0 per 1000 children across Victoria.
- Over 2007 - 2008, the number of families with children aged 0 to 8 years in Northern Grampians who remained in public housing 12 months or more after initial allocation was suppressed due to small numbers.

## Indicators relating to the local community.<sup>3</sup>



- 96.5% of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region were from households who reported being able to get support from friends, family and neighbours in times of crisis/need. This proportion was higher than, but not significantly different to the proportion reported across Victoria (95.2%).
- 97.3% of parents of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region reported that having someone they could turn to for advice when having problems. This proportion was similar to the proportion reported across Victoria (97.1%).
- 97.2% of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region were from households where the parent or guardian agreed that their neighbourhood was safe. This proportion was higher than, but not significantly different to the proportion reported across Victoria (95.1%).

## Supports and services in Northern Grampians.

- During 2008 - 2009, there were 6.9 hospital separations for gastroenteritis per 1,000 children aged 0 to 1 in Northern Grampians. This is less than the rate of hospital separations in Victoria (9.5 per 1,000 children aged under 1) .
- In 2008 - 2009, 93.3 per cent of infants in Northern Grampians received a home consultation visit and 81.5 per cent of children in Northern Grampians attended the 3.5 year key ages and stages visit.
- The kindergarten participation rate in Northern Grampians during 2009 was 89.6%. This was less than the kindergarten participation rate in Victoria (92.7%).
- Prep students attending government schools in Northern Grampians were absent for an average 0.0 days over the 2009 school year. Year 1 students were absent for an average 0.0 days and Year 2 students were absent for an average 0.0 days over the 2009 school year.

## Early childhood services for families in Northern Grampians.

- As at August 2010, there were 11 primary school education providers in Northern Grampians - 9 government, 2 Catholic and 0 independent.
- In 2009, there were 3 funded kindergarten programs in Northern Grampians. Of these, none were kindergarten programs located within a long day care setting.
- As at 22 July 2010, Northern Grampians had 2 multi-service Children's Centres completed or under development, funded by state and local government. These were:
