TAFE Study Area Report

This report provides information about the destinations of 2012 exiting students in schools in your TAFE Study Area (TSA).

On Track follows up young people in the six months after they leave school to obtain data about their post Year 12 education, training and employment destinations.

Data obtained through the *On Track* survey are used to publish post Year 12 education, training and employment destinations celebrating the broad range of outcomes schools create for young people – not just university but studying at TAFE, undertaking apprenticeships and other forms of training or employment. Those not studying or in part-time work who request additional pathway advice and support are referred to Youth Connections providers for help with their career plans.

Since 2003, more than 385,000 Year 10, 11 and 12 school-leavers have participated in *On Track* Surveys.

The first *On Track* Longitudinal Surveys followed groups of 2003 and 2004 school leavers to gain a more detailed picture of their transitions over the four years after they leave school.

The second longitudinal study began in 2008 and followed a cohort of 2007 school leavers until 2011.

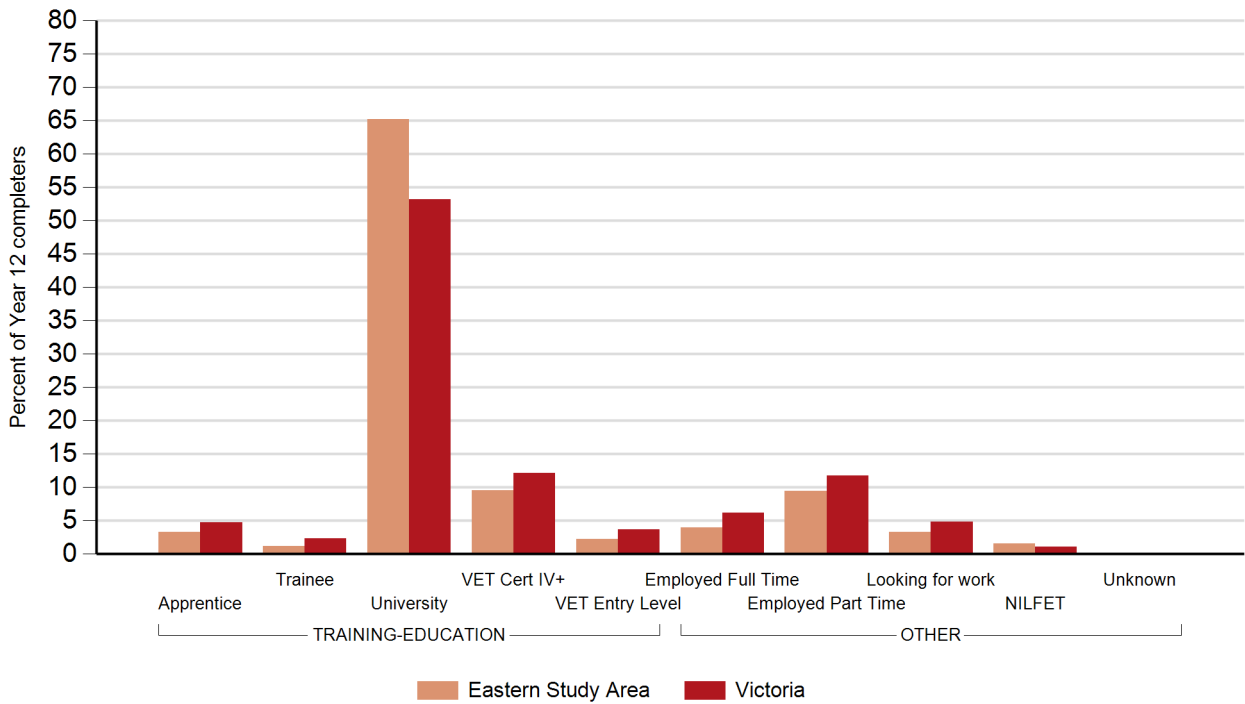

Figure 2 Destinations of 2012 Year 12 or equivalent completers, showing deferrals: Eastern Study Area TSA and Victoria

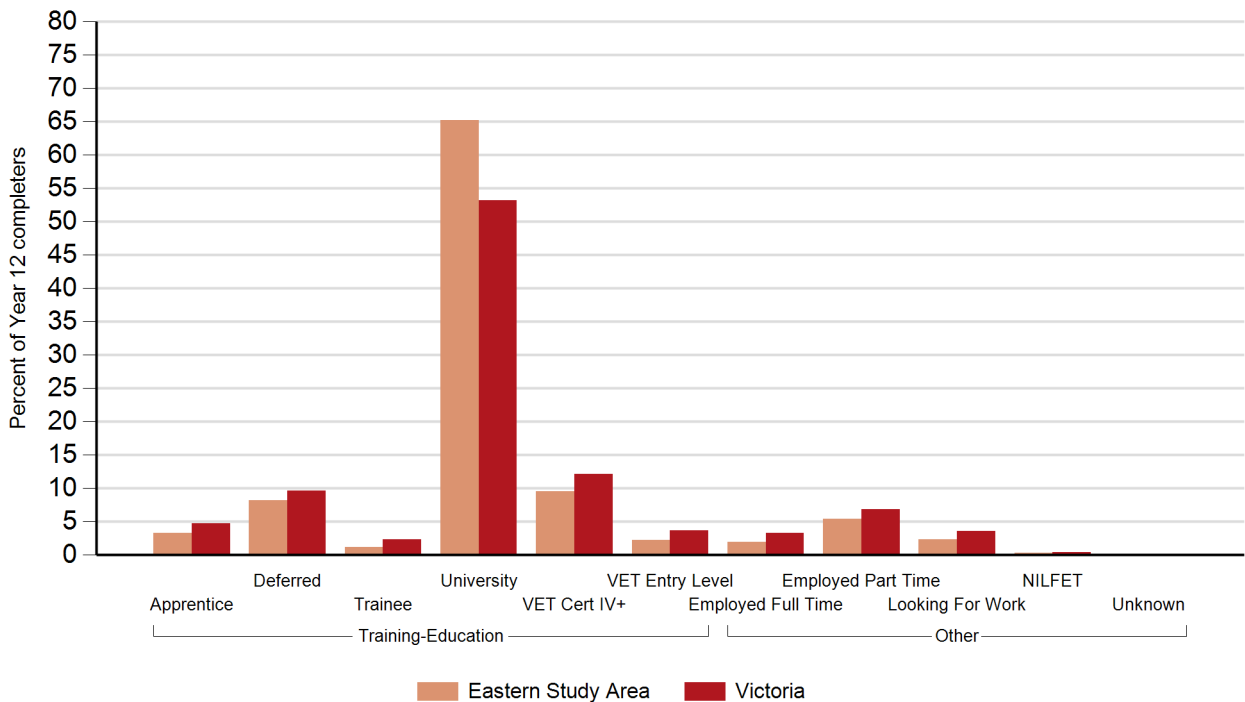


Figure 3 Destinations of 2012 early school leavers: Eastern Study Area TSA and Victoria

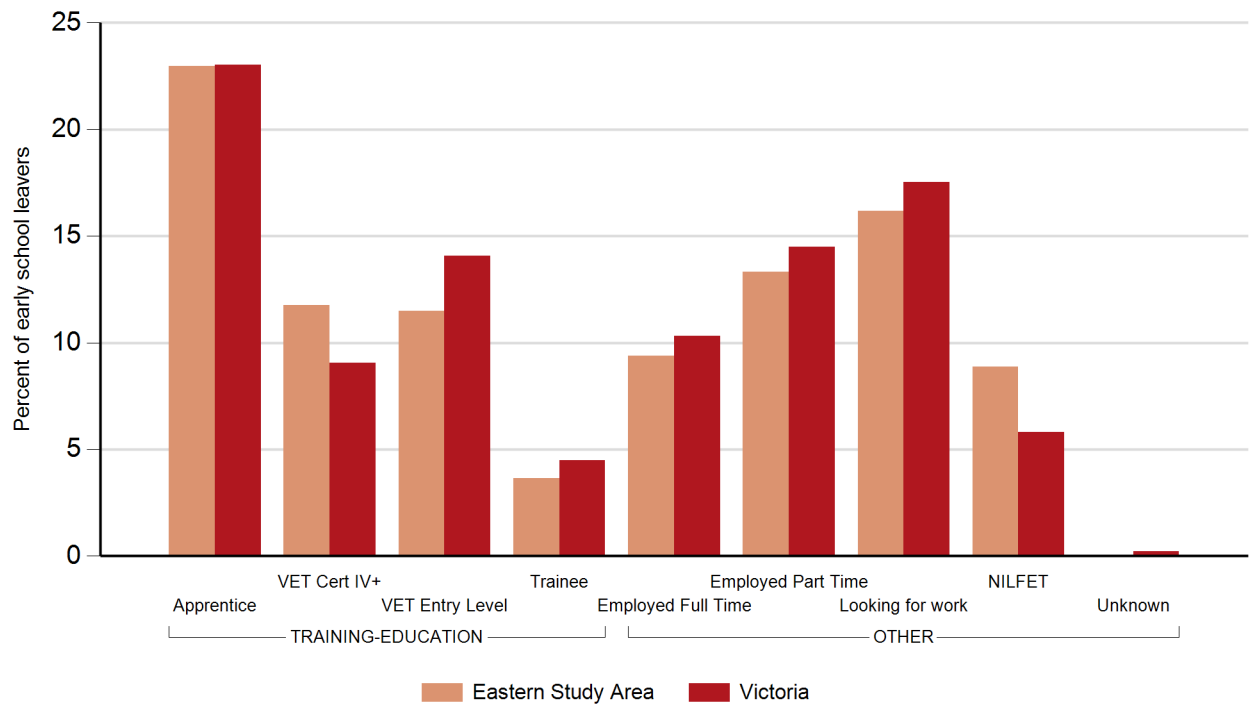
