ISC Mentoring Program

The ISC Mentoring Program seeks to establish a relationship between highly experienced and new ISCs in order to support those newly appointed ISCs in developing their understanding of the International Student Program.

The ISC Mentoring Program is based on the developmental relationship in which a more experienced ISC (mentor) assists a less experienced ISC (mentee).

The mentors choose to participate in this program and provide counsel, insight and guidance to the mentee in the undertaking of the ISC role.

Mentoring may entail informal communication, including faceto-face, phone and electronic contact over the course of the year.

The ISC mentoring relationship is to be based on mutual respect and be an effective and positive experience for both the mentor and mentee, as part of the overarching ISC Professional Learning Program.

ISC Mentoring Tips

- Mentor and Mentee agree on method/s of communication
- Mentee devises lists of questions to make best use of time together
- Mentor shares
 examples of best
 practice and resources
 when relevant
- Mentor shares advice on critical areas of learning during the first year in the ISC role
- Where practical mentors and mentees will be from the same Regional Cluster Network.



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
