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NAB 'Schools First' School-Community partnership applications now open

This opportunity is for Learn Local organisations to foster and enhance partnerships with schools. The 2012 NAB Schools First Awards have **\$3 million** available to 130 outstanding school-community partnerships.



The awards program is divided in to three parts. The *Impact Awards* recognise established school-community partnerships. The *Seed Funding Awards* helps new and developing partnership. The third category awards partnership ideas initiated by students - *The Student Awards*.

The best starting point is to look at the <u>website</u> for further information. Stuck for an idea? The website has literally hundreds of <u>examples</u> of ways in which community organisations have partnered with schools.

The application will need to be lodged by your partner school and there is plenty of time to get talking – you have until 29 June to lodge the application.



e-Learning skills help ACFE staff improve service to the sector

When the ACFE Board needed to roll out the training for its pilot project International Computer Driving Licence (ICDL), the Gippsland team offered to use virtual conferencing (*Blackboard Collaborate*) to benefit organisations from around the state that were unable to travel to the nearest training. And for those who could neither travel nor participate in real-time, the session was recorded and distributed via a link, which could be viewed at any time.

People from as far as Robinvale in the north-west, Wonthaggi in the south and Swifts Creek in the east of Victoria could virtually sit together and access the required training.

Another successful Community Learning Partnership Project recently completed by Springvale Learning and Activities Centre (SLAC)! The project was designed to address the issue of limited participation of CALD learners in VET.

Over 30 participants representing Somali, Turkish, Eritrean and Vietnamese communities took part in consultations, focus groups and specially designed training program. By implementing a range of traditional and innovative engagement approaches, SLAC found out the main local barrier to participation for CALD communities.

This factor is as much complex as it is simple, trust and relationships. "I am really happy that I got involved with SLAC and the project. It was not an easy decision and life is very busy. I cannot thank Mila enough for all the conversations we have had and experiences we shared. I am now about to complete my Diploma, but back in 2010 I thought I would never make it", - said Sahra Jama – a mother of 13 and active project participant. She is also now running her own Family Day Care business.

"It is all about people and relationships. It can be hard work at times, but always pays off. The project was a unique opportunity to build the relationships with communities and make a lot of positive difference in lives of people and groups involved", -Mila Waise, Project Manager.
