2. Provider Forum Change of Details

Please note that there has been a change in the dates for the final provider forum for 2012. Instead of the usual two forums (in Ballarat and Horsham), the final forum for the year will be held in Ararat. The forum will be held at Gum San on Tuesday 30 October. This will be a great chance for providers to network with others in the Region. One of the main agenda items that will be discussed at the forum will be 2013 ACFE Funding overview. Full details will be provided shortly.

3. ACFE Equipment Grant

The Adult Community and Further Education (ACFE) Board has determined the amount of and eligibility for the ACFE Equipment Grant (formerly known as the Commonwealth Equipment Grant) for the 2012/13 Financial Year and approved guidelines for the use and acquittal of the Grant.

A Grant of \$4,000 (excluding GST) has been made to ACE organisations that have a contract with the ACFE Board to deliver government subsidised pre-accredited training in 2012.

The Grant is to be used for the purchase of teaching and learning equipment to support eLearning and/or classroom delivery of pre-accredited and accredited training too hard to reach learners. Guidelines for expenditure and acquittal of the Grant are at Attachment 1.

Eligible organisations will have received the grant payment as part of the third July quarterly payment.

A reminder that AEG funds must be fully spent and the Expenditure Statement submitted to your ACFE regional office by **31 January 2013**. Any unspent funds at that date must be returned to the ACFE Board.

Note: we recommend you acquit this by December 2012.

Please note that the Expenditure Statement should subtotal \$4,000 excluding GST. The TOTAL amount INCLUDING GST should amount to \$4,400.

5. A Message from the ACFE Regional Council- Training Market Analysis

The ACFE Regional Council is pleased to offer providers with an analysis of the training market in the Grampians Region for the 2011 calendar year. A copy of the report has been posted to you.

The report is based primarily on training delivery data you have submitted successfully through the Skills Victoria Training System.

The report has been prepared to support providers and Committees of Management to undertake planning and assist organisations to engage in the Victorian VET system. It has now been published on the ACFE website at www.acfe.vic.gov.au.

When using the data providers should refer to Attachment 1 which defines and clarifies a number of items in the report. Providers are also encouraged to attend the next provider forum in November which will take providers through the regional analysis in detail.

6. GLLEEK project

We have started off with 2 great workshops in Horsham and Ballarat. We set up the technology to communicate with the participating providers through google+ and google hangouts. We also did some brainstorming on strategies for each individual organisation with some exciting ideas generated. Most of the objectives were around developing e-business strategies to support the development of e-learning.

The next step is for Pam and Rheinhard to meet with the providers individually to get the ball rolling for each of them. Rheinhard has been on the road this week and Pam will be starting with her providers from the 20th.

Our providers in St Arnaud are working on an exciting plan to collaborate using google hangouts between the two Houses in Adult Learners week.

11. Good News Story of the Month - Wendouree West Community House

This year, the Wendouree West Community House (WWCH) has commenced delivering the program 'Beginners Computers and Beyond'. The program is a restructured version of a previous computer course run by WWCH adapted to meet the ever changing technology and needs of today's learners.

The program works closely in line with the A-Frame quality framework with delivery taking place in a small classroom. This ensures a fun, friendly and safe environment, enabling Learners to gain confidence in performing basic functions and working Windows based applications.

The program is run over a 16 week period and incorporates delivery by explanation, demonstration, practice and revision into step by step instruction manuals and handouts. Learners are motivated through positive encouragement/ feedback from the tutor and are assessed through observation during set tasks and verbal questioning.

Currently, the program has nine Learners enrolled and is also utilised by volunteers to assist in the provision of job seeking and has proven useful for Teachers Aids in building on current computer skills. The program has demonstrated encouraging results with one Learner already continuing on to accredited training and another gaining full time employment.
