## LODDON MALLEE REGION LEARN LOCAL REGIONAL AND RURAL CONFERENCE 'Thinking Differently, Connecting Differently'

On the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of July, the Regional ACFE Conference 'Thinking Differently, Connecting Differently' was held at the All Seasons Bendigo. The 2 day conference consisted of numerous guest speakers and workshops, with approx. 125 people attending from all over the regions. The main



aim of the conference was to equip regional providers with the concepts and tools to think differently about how they conduct their business and ultimately deliver



exceptional adult learning experiences. In addition, the conference was aimed at providing practical opportunities to discuss emerging issues and best practises colleagues, with vendors and consultants across a broad continuum of education issues. Day 1 focussed on how to approach business in another way. Day

2 focussed on practical skills, e-learning, smart use of technology, models of innovative partnerships and how to conduct business more efficiently. The conference opened with keynote speaker 'Ernesto Sirolli' - who spoke to audiences on 'Enterprise Facilitation Projects – Revitalising Local Communities and Growing Market Share.' Following was keynote speaker Bill Williams,

addressing 'Better Training, Sales Growth, Customer Service People Management.' The afternoon gave participants an opportunity to ask questions and speak openly on personal experiences.





Thursday night kicked off the Official Conference dinner with pre drinks and canapés. The Bendigo Chinese Lion Association provided us with flashes of vibrant colour and

vibrations with their Chinese Dragon display. Throughout the evening we heard from The Flinns, a local 3 piece band that performs regularly in the region. Friday concluded with specialised workshops, addressing topics such as 'New Technologies', 'E Learning',' Neuro Leadership', 'Smart Use of Technology and Innovative Partnerships'.



Participants broke into smaller groups and attended the workshops of their choice. The feedback we have received regarding the conference has been very positive, with attendees lodging a survey with their thoughts and comments.
