# Introduction

All Victorian children can now experience the benefits of 2 years of quality play-based learning. For some families, this includes Pre-Prep. It is important that families are supported to understand what their children can access and how they can register and enrol.

## 2026 snapshot

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from a refugee or asylum seeker background, and children who have had contact with Child Protection have statewide access to Pre-Prep.
- Any child who was supported by Early Start Kindergarten or Access to Early Learning in their Three-Year-Old Kindergarten year is also eligible for Pre-Prep from 2026.
- A further 12 local government areas (LGAs) will start to deliver **Pre-Prep**, following a successful launch in 6 LGAs this year.
- **Three-Year-Old Kindergarten** will move another year closer to full implementation.
- **Free Kinder** continues.







# How to use this communications resource kit

This communications resource kit is for funded services in Ararat Rural City, Gannawarra Shire, Hindmarsh Shire, Murrindindi Shire, Northern Grampians Shire, Yarriambiack Shire, Benalla Rural City, Buloke Shire, Corangamite Shire, East Gippsland Shire, Horsham Rural City, Loddon Shire, Mansfield Shire, Mitchell Shire, Pyrenees Shire, Strathbogie Shire, Wangaratta Rural City and Wodonga Rural City (2025 and 2026 Pre-Prep geographic roll-out).

## Enrol your child in Three-Year-Old Kinder and Pre-Prep

It is time to enrol your children in Three-Year-Old Kindergarten and Pre-Prep programs for 2026.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from a refugee or asylum seeker background and children who have had contact with Child Protection are prioritised for access to Three-Year-Old Kindergarten and Pre-Prep programs. If you are a parent or carer of a child who meets this eligibility criteria, you are encouraged to contact us for more information.

Next year is the first year Pre-Prep will be available in **<insert council name>**, after a successful launch at the start of this year in 6 local government areas. Pre-Prep gives children even greater access to the many benefits of early childhood education.

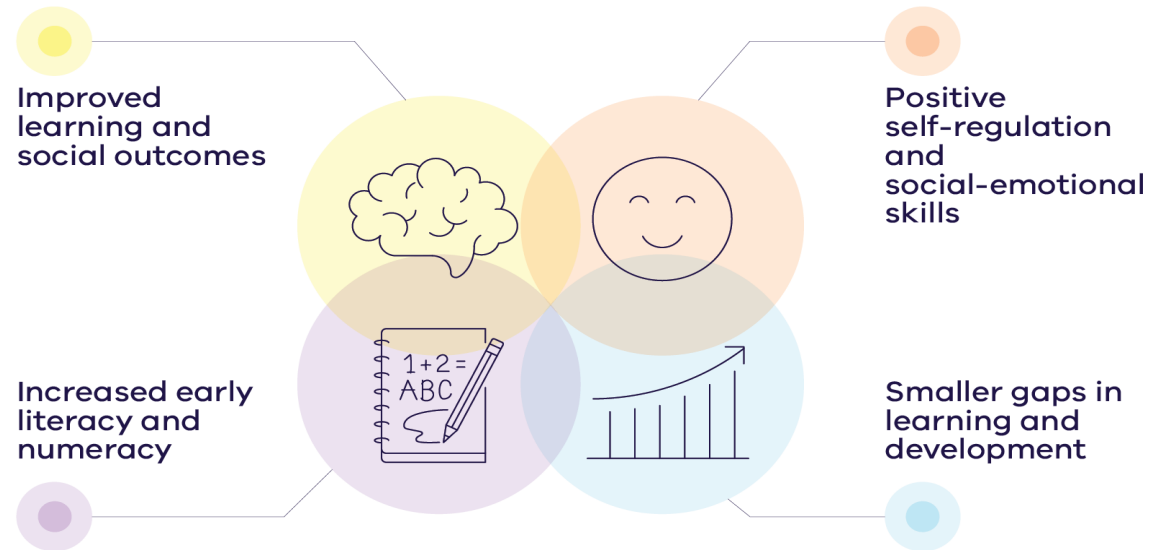
**[For long day care centres]** Free Kinder will continue to be available at our service next year, which means you will receive an annual fee offset.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, children from a refugee or asylum seeker background and children who have had contact with Child Protection are prioritised for access to Three-Year-Old Kindergarten and Pre-Prep programs. Any child who was supported by Early Start Kindergarten or Access to Early Learning in their Three-Year-Old Kindergarten year is also eligible for Pre-Prep from 2026. Pre-Prep hours will range from 16 to 25 hours each week for children who meets this eligibility criteria.

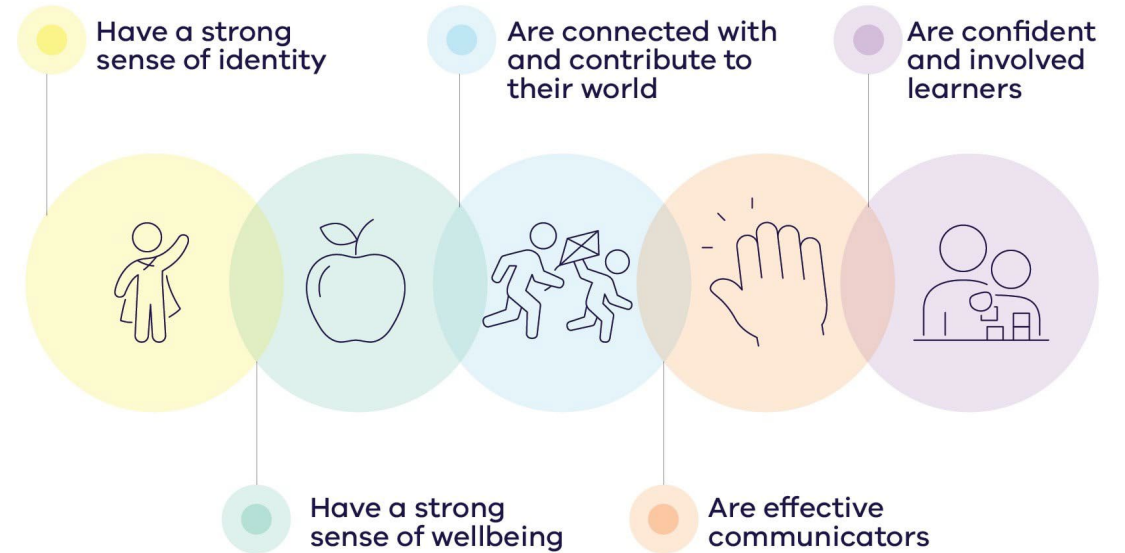

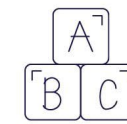

We are one of the first services in Victoria to offer Pre-Prep to all 4-year-olds.

Four-Year-old Kindergarten is gradually transitioning from 15 to 30 hours each week across Victoria. Programs will continue to be play-based and led by a qualified teacher.

Having a longer program in the year before school gives all children more time to learn and grow.

# Key points

You can use the information on the following pages in your online communications and to assist your conversations with families and your community. Share with teachers, educators and any staff at your service who interact with families, to ensure consistent information is being provided.

- **Free interpreting services**

Remember, your service can access free on-site telephone and video interpreters for conversations with families. If your service participates in a council Central Registration and Enrolment Scheme (CRES), the CRES team also has access to free interpreting services and may have additional staff, such as CALD Outreach Workers, to help families to understand what their child can access and how they can register and enrol.

If parents and carers are seeking more information or want to know about support available for their child to access and participate in programs, you can also provide them with information from the Kindergarten Sector Guide. This guide has key information about the Best Start, Best Life reforms and the support available for children to access and participate in kindergarten programs.

# Free Kinder

- Free Kinder is available (if your service is participating) for Three- and Four-Year-Old Kindergarten programs, and Pre-Prep in 2026.
- Free Kinder is for everyone – you don't need to be a permanent resident or Australian citizen to access a free kindergarten program.
- Free Kinder can only be accessed at one service at a time.

## ***Sessional kindergartens***

- Free Kinder provides families with a free program. Our service is offering Free Kinder for all our kindergarten programs in 2026.
- For Three-Year-Old Kindergarten, Free Kinder will mean a free program between 5 and 15 hours per week. Our service will offer [insert number] hours each week in 2026.
- For Four-Year-Old Kindergarten, Free Kinder will mean a free program of 15 hours each week (600 hours a year) in 2026 OR For Pre-Prep, Free Kinder will mean a free program for [insert number] hours each week at our service in 2026.

## Free Kinder continued ...

### ***Long day care services***

- Families with children enrolled in long day care kindergarten programs at participating long day care services will receive an annual fee offset.
- For children enrolled in a 15-hour kindergarten program in 2025 at our service, this is saving families up to \$2,101.
- Children enrolled in a Three-Year-Old Kindergarten program of less than 15 hours are receiving a pro-rata amount.
- Similarly, children enrolled in a Pre-Prep program of 16-30 hours will receive a pro-rata amount.
- If children access more than the set hours (e.g. 15 hours for Three- and Four-Year Old kindergarten), any additional hours are not covered by the offset.
- If families are eligible for the Commonwealth Childcare Subsidy (CCS), this will be applied first and then the Free Kinder offset. This means families only need to pay the remaining amount after CCS and the Free Kinder offset have been applied.

## Three-Year-Old Kindergarten

- Three-Year-Old Kindergarten program hours will vary from service to service, providing families with between 5 and 15 hours each week. Our service will offer [insert number] hours each week in 2026.
- Starting a quality kindergarten program at an earlier age leads to positive effects on child development. Kindergarten is a safe place for children to build skills, become more independent, and make friends.
- Use the [Starting Age Calculator](#) on the Department of Education's website to enter your child's birth date to find out what year they can start Three- and Four-Year-Old Kindergarten.

## Pre-Prep

- Four-Year-Old Kindergarten is becoming Pre-Prep, with programs increasing from 15 to 30 hours each week by full roll-out.
- Pre-Prep will be available at our service in 2026 – the Pre-Prep program will be for [insert number] hours each week.
- Pre-Prep offers a longer program in the year before school, which means there will be more time for children to deepen their learning and development.
- Pre-Prep is a play-based learning program led by qualified teachers. Like Four-Year-Old Kindergarten, Pre-Prep will follow the Victorian Early Years Learning and Development Framework.

## Pre-Prep – 2026 priority cohort roll-out

- From 2026, between 16 and 25 hours of Pre-Prep will be available statewide to:
  - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children
  - children from a refugee or asylum seeker background
  - children who have had contact with Child Protection services
  - children supported by Early Start Kindergarten or Access to Early Learning in their Three-Year-Old Kindergarten year.
- The Pre-Prep program for children from a priority cohort group will be for [insert number] hours each week at our service.
- If you think your child meets one of the eligibility criteria for Pre-Prep, talk to us about what the program may look like for your child in 2026.
- If your child is currently accessing Early Start Kindergarten at our service in 2025, they are eligible for Pre-Prep from 2026.



## Early Start Kindergarten

- Early Start Kindergarten (ESK) continues to be available for eligible 3-year-old children, providing 15 hours of kindergarten each week.
- To be eligible for ESK, children must be aged 3 by 30 April in the year they start kindergarten, and either:
  - identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
  - be from a refugee or asylum seeker background, or
  - be from a family that has had contact with Child Protection.
- ESK eligible children can access a 3-year-old group, 4-year-old group, a mixed-age group, or a combination of groups to achieve 15 hours per week.
- It is important that our service enrolls eligible children in ESK, even if Free Kinder or funded Three-Year-Old Kindergarten is available. This ensures eligible children have priority of access, and services can receive additional funding and support.
- Children who are eligible or have access to ESK in 2025 will be able to access Pre-Prep in 2026.

# Koorie Kids Shine

- Koorie Kids Shine celebrates culture and promotes the benefits of kindergarten for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children.
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children aged 3 and 4 can access 15 hours of free kindergarten each week through Early Start Kindergarten.
- Kindergartens work hard to create culturally safe places for Koorie children and families and include Aboriginal perspectives in the learning curriculum and environment.
- At kinder, Koorie kids will learn the skills they need that will help them do well in future years at school, including:
  - build their sense of identity
  - explore how they fit into the world around them
  - learn how to communicate with others
  - strengthen their physical, social and emotional wellbeing
  - feel confident in learning and trying new things.

# Registration and enrolment

- Many councils offer a Central Registration and Enrolment Scheme (CRES) that enables families to register for multiple kindergarten services within a local government area. If your service doesn't use CRES, it may be helpful to explain to families how to enrol in your programs and what steps are involved.

## <For services who use CRES>

- Our service is part of the Central Registration and Enrolment System (CRES), which is managed by the [insert local council]. This system makes registering and enrolling your child easy and fair. You can use one form to register your interest in several kindergarten programs.
- You can contact [insert your local council information] for support with the registration and enrolment process. You will need to prepare documents such as child's birth certificate, immunisation statement, healthcare card, proof of residence (e.g., utilities bill).
- Register for a first-round offer by [insert date]. You can still register after that but registering in the first round gives you the best chance of getting a place in your preferred kinder program.
- [Insert council] will send you updates by email or text message when your child is offered a kindergarten place. They will also advise how many weeks you have to respond to your offer. If you are unhappy with your offer, you can reject it and ask for another offer in the next round.
- Once you accept your place, if it is at our service, we will help you enrol your child and prepare you for day one. If you are enrolling in our program, we will contact you for additional information about your child, such as [include relevant details, such as dietary requirements, medical conditions etc].

**Play-based learning  
and your child**

Young children are naturally motivated to play. Research shows that in children's early years, play is also the best way for them to learn and grow.

**What is play-based learning?**

Play-based learning supports children to explore and make sense of themselves and their world. It builds on children's natural curiosity.

Through hands-on exploration of the world around them, children learn in many ways. For example, playing with sand and water helps children learn about mathematical ideas, such as weight and volume, and playing with dolls and dress-up helps children learn about families and how to relate to others.

This approach to early childhood education supports children to learn and extend their development through activities and experiences that they find enjoyable and interesting.

Programs that help children to learn through play are supported by educators who will provide children opportunities for:

- **adult-led learning** where the educator plans or introduces a learning activity or topic to intentionally direct the child's learning
- **child-directed play and learning** where the child leads their own learning through exploration, imagination and experimentation
- **guided play and learning** where educators involve themselves in children's spontaneous play and extend their learning as opportunities arise

**Why is play-based learning important?**

Play-based learning is now widely understood to be one of the most important ways to support children to develop the skills and understanding they need to live well now and into the future.

There is strong evidence that the pathways in children's brains are positively influenced by the experiences that happen during play.

Play supports children in all areas of their development, including their understanding of themselves and relationships with others, their capacity to communicate, their self-worth, how they communicate effectively with others and how they work alone and solve problems.

Positive attitudes towards learning, such as persistence, curiosity and imagination are all developed during play. These attitudes set children up for a life-long love of learning.

**Play-based learning important approaches at home:**

Children are learning all the time. There are many opportunities for children to learn at home, including in everyday activities such as getting ready in the morning, grocery shopping or doing household jobs.

Consider some of the ideas below:

- at bath time, introduce science and maths concepts such as floating, sinking, heavy, full, empty, full and so on, using a simple container in the water
- when hanging out the washing, ask your child to help you sort, say, three pairs, but skip the socks, or ask about bigger, longer, smaller and so on using clothes
- at mealtimes, describe ingredients, flavours, colours, textures to introduce new words and concepts, such as where the ingredients come from
- when reading books, use the pictures to prompt further conversation or explain the text
- when driving or walking, describe what you are seeing, ask open questions

**Why is kindergarten important?**

Kindergarten helps prepare children for success at school and in life. At kindergarten, children use play to learn about language, numbers and patterns. They also learn how to get along with others, share, listen and manage their emotions. Teachers help children become curious, creative and confident about learning. Research shows that two years of kindergarten are better than one.

**What is Early Start Kindergarten?**

Early Start Kindergarten gives three-year-old children from a refugee or asylum seeker background 15 hours per week of free or low-cost kindergarten.

Applications for Early Start Kindergarten are made by the kindergarten. The Early Start Kindergarten grant is paid directly to the kindergarten.

**Is my child eligible?**

Your child is eligible if you or your child:

- have a refugee or humanitarian visa, or
- are applying for a refugee or humanitarian visa, or
- have a current or expired ImmiCard.

If none of these apply but you or your child have been a refugee or asylum seeker, or had similar experiences, your child may still be eligible.

Contact your local Department of Education and Training office to ask about an exemption. You can also ask any professional who supports you to contact the Department for you.

**How do I enrol my child?**


Early Start Kindergarten is available in all kindergarten programs with a qualified teacher. You can enrol your child by contacting a kindergarten near you or your council. Tell the kindergarten if you need an interpreter. They can use free telephone interpreting services. If you need help to enrol, ask the Department of Education and Training, or any professional who supports you, such as a:

- support worker
- bilingual worker
- maternal and child health nurse
- supported playgroup facilitator.

**Should my child go to four-year-old kindergarten?**

Yes. After Early Start Kindergarten, your child is eligible for free or low-cost four-year-old kindergarten. This will help them to keep building on their strengths.
