

Early Childhood Education

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Dear Parents and Carers

Children aged 5 to 11 can now get the COVID-19 vaccination. This includes 5-year-olds who attend early childhood education and care services.

Please help your child get vaccinated before the end of January (when Term 1 starts for school and kindergarten) or as soon as they turn 5.

Bookings are now open. Children will need 2 separate appointments for 2 doses of the vaccination, 8 weeks apart.

Vaccines stop people getting very sick and help stop the COVID-19 virus spreading.

Children do not have to get vaccinated to attend school or early childhood education and care, but it is the best way to keep them all safe.

Make a booking

Bookings are available now.

You will be able to book a vaccine appointment at a participating general practice, pharmacy or community health service, or at <u>state vaccination centres</u>.

The Department of Health's <u>Coronavirus Hotline</u> 1800 675 398 can help you book an appointment. They can also answer questions you have about vaccination.
