STATEMENT OF EXPECTATIONS 2020-22 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING AS REGULATORY AUTHORITY FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND CARE SERVICES

Thank you for your letter dated 19 February 2021, providing your 2020-22 Statement of Expectations (SOE) for the Department of Education and Training (DET).

This response relates to the 2020-22 Statements of Expectation you have issued to the Regulatory Authority, about the regulation of early childhood education and care (ECEC) services across Victoria. This response has been prepared and its activities will be implemented by the Department's Quality Assessment and Regulation Division (QARD) who have been delegated to undertake most of the responsibilities of the Regulatory Authority for early childhood education and care under the Education and Care Services National Law Act 2010 and associated regulations, and the Victorian Children's Services Act 1996 and their respective regulations.

QARD will continue to prioritise its regulatory activities towards motivating and facilitating the delivery of high-quality early childhood education and care services to ensure children's safety and wellbeing are paramount and their learning and development opportunities are maximised.
