Discover more about your local Tech School

In Victoria we have 10 new schools where students can use and learn about the latest technology and equipment. These are called Tech Schools.

Tech Schools help students and teachers build skills in science, technology, engineering and maths; these are called STEM skills. Tech Schools also help students think creatively and work together to solve problems. These skills are very important for jobs in the future. Employers say the need for these skills is growing.

Tech Schools are not the same as the old Technical Schools. Tech Schools are new and have programs that students need today. Students get to work on real-world problems and can use high-tech things like:

- Virtual reality
- Robotics
- 3D Printing.

Students in secondary schools can use Tech Schools. They go to their local school and do some classes at their nearest Tech School. Classes at Tech Schools do not cost extra money.

We have spent \$128 million to build these schools. We have also put aside more money to make sure these schools continue to have the latest technology. Tech schools can be used by government, independent and Catholic school students.
