

2010 Early Childhood Community Profile Summary sheet for the Shire of Golden Plains

Local demographics for young children aged 0 to 8 years and their families.¹

- There were 223 births notified to the local Maternal and Child Health services in Golden Plains during 2008-09. This represents an increase of 13.0 per cent since 2006-07 and an increase of 18.6 per cent since 2000-01. This compares to an increase in birth notifications across Victoria of 2.3 per cent since 2006-07 and 18.6 per cent since 2000-01.
- At 30 June 2008, there was an estimated 17,681 people residing in Golden Plains. Of these, 2,309 were aged between 0 to 8 years, representing 13.1 per cent of Golden Plains's total population.
- The population aged 0 to 8 years in Golden Plains is projected to increase by 8.9 per cent by 2026, while the total population in Golden Plains is expected to increase by 42.8 per cent over this period.
- Using the Index of Relative Socioeconomic Disadvantage, Golden Plains was ranked 60 out of 79 LGAs in Victoria. A rank of 1 was assigned to the most disadvantaged LGA in Victoria.
- Of the 1,278 families with children aged between 0 and 8 years in Golden Plains, 88.8 per cent were couple families and 11.2 per cent were one parent families.
- There were 91 Aboriginal persons in Golden Plains, representing 0.6 per cent of the total population. 28.6 per cent of the Aboriginal population in Golden Plains were aged 0 to 8 years.

Health, learning, wellbeing, development and safety indicators for children in the local area.²

- 50.7 per cent of infants in Golden Plains were fully breastfed at 3 months and 39.1 per cent of infants were fully breastfed at 6 months.
- 94.3 per cent of children in Golden Plains were fully immunised at 12-<15 months, 97.6 per cent were fully immunised at 24-<27 months and 80.4 per cent were fully immunised at 60-<63 months.
- 291 Prep children were surveyed in the Australian Early Development Index (AEDI) in Golden Plains during 2009. Of these, 14.0 per cent were vulnerable on one or more domains and 7.7 per cent were vulnerable on two or more domains.
- In 2008, 83.5% students enrolled in government schools in Golden Plains were achieving a reading accuracy score of 90% or more on Level 5 texts, 89.3% of Year 1 students were reading Level 15 texts with over 90% accuracy and 95.4% of Year 2 students were achieving 90% accuracy or higher on Level 20 texts.

Families in Golden Plains.

- Based on the 2009 VCHWS survey results, 48.2% of children aged 6 months to 12 years were reported to have been read to almost every day in the Grampians region. This was similar to the proportion of children being read to almost every day across Victoria (48.3%).
- Based on the 2009 VCHWS, 3.3% of main carer's of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region were classified as being of high risk of psychological distress. This proportion was lower, but not significantly different to that reported across Victoria (3.7%).
- In 2008 2009, 7 substantiated cases of child abuse were recorded in Golden Plains, representing a rate of 3.0 per 1,000 children aged 0 to 8 years in the area. This compares to a rate of 7.0 per 1000 children across Victoria.
- Over 2007 2008, the number of families with children aged 0 to 8 years in Golden Plains who remained in public housing 12 months or more after initial allocation was suppressed due to small numbers.



Indicators relating to the local community.3

- 96.5% of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region were from households who reported being able to get support from friends, family and neighbours in times of crisis/need. This proportion was higher than, but not significantly different to the proportion reported across Victoria (95.2%).
- 97.3% of parents of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region reported that having someone they could turn to for advice when having problems. This proportion was similar to the proportion reported across Victoria (97.1%).
- 97.2% of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Grampians region were from households where the parent or guardian agreed that their neighbourhood was safe. This proportion was higher than, but not significantly different to the proportion reported across Victoria (95.1%).

Supports and services in Golden Plains.

- During 2008 2009, there were 6.9 hospital separations for gastroenteritis per 1,000 children aged 0 to 1 in Golden Plains. This is less than the rate of hospital separations in Victoria (9.5 per 1,000 children aged under 1)
- In 2008 2009, 102.6 per cent of infants in Golden Plains received a home consulation visit and 70.4 per cent of children in Golden Plains attended the 3.5 year key ages and stages visit.
- The kindergarten participation rate in Golden Plains during 2009 was 97.4%. This was greater than the kindergarten participation rate in Victoria (92.7%).
- Prep students attending government schools in Golden Plains were absent for an average 13.0 days over the 2009 school year. Year 1 students were absent for an average 14.0 days and Year 2 students were absent for an average 12.6 days over the 2009 school year.

Early childhood services for families in Golden Plains.

- As at August 2010, there were 12 primary school education providers in Golden Plains 12 government, 0 Catholic and 0 independent.
- In 2009, there were 8 funded kindergarten programs in Golden Plains. Of these, 1 were kindergarten programs located within a long day care setting.
- As at 22 July 2010, Golden Plains had 1 multi-service Children's Centres completed or under development, funded by state and local government. These were:
