

2010 Early Childhood Community Profile

Summary sheet for the Shire of Mansfield



Local demographics for young children aged 0 to 8 years and their families.¹

- There were 93 births notified to the local Maternal and Child Health services in Mansfield during 2008-09. This represents a decrease of 2.2 per cent since 2006-07. This compares to an increase in birth notifications across Victoria of 2.3 per cent since 2006-07
- At 30 June 2008, there was an estimated 7,691 people residing in Mansfield. Of these, 738 were aged between 0 to 8 years, representing 9.6 per cent of Mansfield's total population.
- The population aged 0 to 8 years in Mansfield is projected to increase by 13.0 per cent by 2026, while the total population in Mansfield is expected to increase by 46.6 per cent over this period.
- Using the Index of Relative Socioeconomic Disadvantage, Mansfield was ranked 50 out of 79 LGAs in Victoria. A rank of 1 was assigned to the most disadvantaged LGA in Victoria.
- Of the 379 families with children aged between 0 and 8 years in Mansfield, 86.0 per cent were couple families and 14.0 per cent were one parent families.
- There were 37 Aboriginal persons in Mansfield, representing 0.5 per cent of the total population. The proportion of the Aboriginal population in Mansfield aged 0 to 8 years could not be derived due to small numbers.

Health, learning, wellbeing, development and safety indicators for children in the local area.²

- 74.1 per cent of infants in Mansfield were fully breastfed at 3 months and 46.9 per cent of infants were fully breastfed at 6 months.
- 94.3 per cent of children in Mansfield were fully immunised at 12-<15 months, 86.6 per cent were fully immunised at 24-<27 months and 75.0 per cent were fully immunised at 60-<63 months.
- 55 Prep children were surveyed in the Australian Early Development Index (AEDI) in Mansfield during 2009. Of these, 3.8 per cent were vulnerable on one or more domains and 1.9 per cent were vulnerable on two or more domains.
- In 2008, 83.3% students enrolled in government schools in Mansfield were achieving a reading accuracy score of 90% or more on Level 5 texts, 65.3% of Year 1 students were reading Level 15 texts with over 90% accuracy and 89.7% of Year 2 students were achieving 90% accuracy or higher on Level 20 texts.

Families in Mansfield.

- Based on the 2009 VCHWS survey results, 47.2% of children aged 6 months to 12 years were reported to have been read to almost every day in the Hume region. This was less than, but not significantly different to the proportion of children being read to almost every day across Victoria (48.3%).
- Based on the 2009 VCHWS, 4.3% of main carer's of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Hume region were classified as being of high risk of psychological distress. This proportion was higher, but not significantly different to that reported across Victoria (3.7%).
- In 2008 - 2009, the number of substantiated cases of child abuse in Mansfield were suppressed due to small numbers and therefore a rate of child abuse substantiations could not be derived. This compares to a rate of 7.0 per 1000 children across Victoria.
- Over 2007 - 2008, the number of families with children aged 0 to 8 years in Mansfield who remained in public housing 12 months or more after initial allocation was suppressed due to small numbers.

Indicators relating to the local community.³



- 95.6% of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Hume region were from households who reported being able to get support from friends, family and neighbours in times of crisis/need. This proportion was similar to the proportion reported across Victoria (95.2%).
- 97.3% of parents of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Hume region reported that having someone they could turn to for advice when having problems. This proportion was similar to the proportion reported across Victoria (97.1%).
- 96.0% of children aged 0 to 12 years in the Hume region were from households where the parent or guardian agreed that their neighbourhood was safe. This proportion was higher than, but not significantly different to the proportion reported across Victoria (95.1%).

Supports and services in Mansfield.

- During 2008 - 2009, there were 13.4 hospital separations for gastroenteritis per 1,000 children aged 0 to 1 in Mansfield. This is greater than the rate of hospital separations in Victoria (9.5 per 1,000 children aged under 1) .
- In 2008 - 2009, 97.9 per cent of infants in Mansfield received a home consultation visit and 62.4 per cent of children in Mansfield attended the 3.5 year key ages and stages visit.
- The kindergarten participation rate in Mansfield during 2009 was 90.8%. This was less than the kindergarten participation rate in Victoria (92.7%).
- Prep students attending government schools in Mansfield were absent for an average 4.9 days over the 2009 school year. Year 1 students were absent for an average 14.5 days and Year 2 students were absent for an average 14.8 days over the 2009 school year.

Early childhood services for families in Mansfield.

- As at August 2010, there were 5 primary school education providers in Mansfield - 3 government, 1 Catholic and 1 independent.
- In 2009, there were 2 funded kindergarten programs in Mansfield. Of these, none were kindergarten programs located within a long day care setting.
- As at 22 July 2010, Mansfield had no multi-service Children's Centres completed or under development, funded by state and local government.
