Everyone in our school communities deserves to be respected, valued and treated equally.

Discrimination or abuse based on religion or race is not tolerated

If a child has been the target of, or has witnessed, religious or racial discrimination or abuse, we encourage their parent or carer to report it to their school.

School staff can ensure appropriate action and support is provided.

A parent or carer may wish to make a formal complaint about the incident to the school or regional office.
