'The real power belongs to the people.'

Greta Thunberg, Swedish Environmental Activist

"... I always describe the movement as an ecosystem. You know, in the forest, the birds, the worms, the trees, they all serve their own unique purpose. They work together and they can't replace each other, but they work in harmony with each other. So, I would say find what you're already good at...because we need artists in this movement, we need people who know about technology in this movement, we need organizers, we need writers, we need all of the different talents in the movement. So, I'd say find what you already do, what you're already good at, and apply that...'
