

PEER OBSERVATION TEMPLATE

Working through the template

The peer observation template has been designed to provide a structure for the observer to record their observations while in the classroom and immediately following the observation. The use of this template is optional.

Step 1. Details of classroom being observed

The observer should record the date, time and location of the observed classroom. The nature of the lesson (e.g. year level and learning focus) should also be recorded.

d) Celebrations What aspects of the observation went well? What aspects of the observation should be shared with relevant collegiate groups?				
e) Questions The observer might have questions to clarify with the teacher after the observations or thoughts which can be listed here.				
f) Opportunities Was there anything that could be done differently to enhance student learning?
