Semester Two. This commitment also enables additional TAFEs across the TAFE network to deliver the course to meet emerging community need and industry demand.

The Government has invested \$4.1 million to further expand the Free TAFE Course List, adding the Diploma of Auslan and Advanced Diploma of Interpreting (Auslan English) to the current offering, due to commence on 1 January 2023. These commitments are in addition to the expansion of the Free TAFE initiative to offer more than 60 courses in 2022, helping to address Victoria's skills and training needs for its future. From 1 July 2022, the current Course in Working Safely in the Solar Industry will be available as a Free TAFE Short Course.
