



Master of Teaching (Secondary) Accelerated Hybrid Program

Delivered in partnership with the Victorian Department of Education and Training (DET), this innovative ITE program can assist with your unique staffing needs.

The aim of the program is to boost the teaching workforce particularly in areas where additional secondary teachers are needed.

In the program this year, FedUni has 60 career changers able to teach Maths, Science, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, English, Languages, Humanities, History, Business Studies, IT, Art, Psychology, Drama, PE and Health. They live in all parts of the state and come with rich life and industry experience. Many are prepared to relocate and live in regional and rural areas.

How does it work?

The accelerated program is completed over 1.5 years.

- Pre-service teachers (PSTs) receive a \$15,000 stipend from the DET to assist with studies.
- FedUni and DET match PSTs to schools based on schools' employment needs and PSTs' preferences.
- During the first two semesters of the program, PSTs complete a 25 day placement with the host school and complete the regular university program.
- Students have the option to study on campus or online.
- The university program includes two intensives located in partnership schools in Ballarat.
- PSTs have a university mentor and a school mentor who provide support and expertise.
- In the final 6 months of the program, PSTs have VIT permission to teach in the host school as a paraprofessional. After graduation they can continue to teach in the school but there is no obligation to do so.
